CURRICULUM CONTENTS Lecture

Tutorial

The fundamental idea is to show that it is impossible to treat any institution of constitutional law separately. All of them create one system of government. First of all, the course aims at answering the question of how constitutional rules could be understood. Another problem on which the classes will concentrate is the shape of human and civil rights regulation within the state, and especially intercourses between internal and international law will be taken into

account. After that, the course turns focus to the rule of sovereignty of the people, especially to the relation of representative democracy versus direct democracy. The main part of the course responds to the question of the Polish system of the government in the context of separation of powers, presenting the constitutional position of legislative, executive and judicial powers and interactions between them.
